Florida House faces DeSantis over tax cuts

Feud with Perez appears likely to continue into 2026

Gov. Ron DeSantis has seen the Florida House's property tax cut proposals and he's not a fan.

In a late-night social media post on Oct. 22, DeSantis panned the eight bills released by the House earlier this month.

"Placing more than one property tax measure on the ballot represents an attempt to kill anything on property taxes," DeSantis posted on X. "It's a political game, not a serious attempt to get it done for the people."

House Speaker Daniel Perez, R-Miami, detailed the bills in a memo to members on Oct. 16, saving lawmakers should have "faith" in voters to decide

approve.

"It is our position that the House does not need to limit itself in presenting one single plan, but instead allow the people of Florida the ability to

choose some, all, or none of the proposals on the 2026 ballot," Perez wrote.

On Oct. 23. Perez fired back in a statement to the Florida Politics website.

which ballot measures to saying DeSantis has no plan.

"It's unclear what he wants to do. I've personally reached out to share with him the House's proposals and he has, so far, not wanted to engage in a conversation," Perez told the news site. "So when the Governor says he wants to 'abolish' property taxes: How? We don't have any details."

The dispute is an indication the clash

Curious what's happening at the construction

site of Naples Comprehensive Health's new \$295 million cardiac center? If you've driven by NCH Baker Hospital at Sev-

enth Street North you can see the massive drill and other equipment behind the fenced barrier at the site adjacent to the hospital.

Groundbreaking was held in June for the 189,000-square-foot heart and stroke center that will be five stories. Construction is expected to take two years. A new parking garage also is planned.

The construction site means part of the

hospital's surface parking lot is fenced off yet valet parking is available for all visitors.

A massive drill at the site is a Fundex F3500 and

is a fixed mast drill rig used for a lot of different deep foundations, according to Alex McIntyre, senior project manager and licensed drone pilot with Gibrane Building Company.

"This one was utilized to drill approximately 800 14" diameter 60' long piles into the ground and fill with concrete to support the R.M. Schulze Family Heart and Stroke Critical Care Center and the parking garage," McIntyre said in an email.

The drill is expected to be on site until mid-November.

Industry Appreciation Awards look to future

Economic development leaders recognized

Big dogs in Southwest Florida economic development and up and comers were honored Friday Oct. 24 in the annual 2025 Industry Appreciation Awards.

Attended by hundreds of business professionals at the Caloosa Sound Convention Center in downtown Fort Myers, the awards honor Lee County merchants and leaders driving growth and innovation across the region, according to organizers. The gathering was held by the Horizon Council, the Horizon Foundation and the Lee County Economic Development Office.

Many of the finalists are reflective of what's to come in the future and more, according to John Talmage, the latter's director who makes the rounds in reports to local governments and organizations such as the Southwest Regional Manufacturers Association, preaching the gospel of county expansion.

"Smart manufacturing is where we're headed." Talmage said of a shift from traditional production to digitally enhanced systems with efficiency in mind. "It's about integrating data, automation and human skill. We want Lee County to be a hub for that where innovation meets production."

What happened to Jimmy Hoffa? Naples man tries to answer in new book

What if a reliable eyewitness had watched Jimmy Hoffa vanish — never to be seen again — from that restaurant parking lot in a Detroit suburb 50 years ago?

Author Lew Paper has some ideas to solve one of America's most notorious mysteries, so he developed them into his acclaimed novel "Legacy of Lies: An Historical Thriller."

Paper, a Harvard Law School graduate who previously published five nonfiction books, will talk about "Legacy of Lies" on Thursday afternoon, Nov. 6, as the second speaker in the Author Spotlight Series for the Friends of the Library of Collier County.

Author Spotlight Series supports libraries

This year, the series expanded to three guest authors at The Norris Center in downtown Naples. Sarah Penner, author of "The Amalfi Curse," spoke on Oct. 9. The series concludes on Thursday, April 9, with Rowan Beaird, author of the novel "The Divorcées."

Through events like the Author Spotlight Series, the nonprofit Friends group raises hundreds of thousands of dollars to support Collier's public libraries. Only a few tickets remain to see Paper on Nov. 6. Each talk will be followed by a Q-and-A and a book signing. (See info box for details on dates, times and all ticket prices.)

Paper, a New Jersey native who spent his career in Washington, D.C., now lives in Naples. His previous nonfiction books include "In the Cauldron: Terror, Tension, and the American Ambassador's Struggle to Avoid Pearl Harbor" and "Perfect: Don Larsen's Miraculous World Series Game and the Men Who Made It Happen."

His latest, the historical novel "Legacy of Lies," has been named a finalist for Best Thriller by the National Indie Excellence Awards, whose commendation stated: "Your work exemplifies the passion, creativity, and excellence this award was established to recognize. In a highly competitive field, your book truly stood out, earning the admiration of our expert panel of judges."

Hoffa's history of controversy

"Legacy of Lies" also was long-listed for Best Historical Fiction by the Goethe Awards.

The nation's fascination with Hoffa's disappearance and apparent murder has barely waned in the past 50 years.


Hoffa was such a striking and controversial figure, as the incredibly powerful union boss of the Teamsters, with his ties to organized crime; his convictions and imprisonment for fraud, bribery and jury-tampering; and his conflicts with Robert F. Kennedy and later with President Richard Nixon's administration.

So, Lew, let's talk about Hoffa:

Your first book - a look at John F. Kennedy's presidency — was published 50 years ago. Since then you've authored six other books on topics ranging from baseball to the Supreme Court to Pearl Harbor, and now Jimmy Hoffa. How do you select topics for

I have two basic criteria for selecting a book topic. First, it has to be something that interests me. If I'm going to spend a lot of time dealing with the topic —

How to watch new Florida Highwaymen movie on streaming this week

The Florida Highwaymen were an iconic group of Black artists who lived predominantly in Fort Pierce and Gifford in the 1950s. They got their start painting Florida landscapes under the tutelage of founder Alfred Hair, Harold Newton and white artist A.E. "Bean" or "Beanie" Backus.

Jim Crow-era laws prohibited Black artists from displaying their art in galleries, so they sold their paintings on the streets to hotels, offices and on the side of the road for about \$25.

About 70 years later, their story will be released on

and we're talking about years — it has to be a subject that engages me. And second, it has to be something that is marketable. No matter how interesting to me, it has to be a topic that will attract readers. The criteria are easy to articulate but difficult to implement. I've gone down a lot of rabbit holes with my agent trying to find a topic that satisfies both criteria.

What made you want to write about Jimmy Hoffa's disappearance for "Legacy of Lies"?

I have been fascinated with Jimmy Hoffa's disappearance for a long time. Part of it is Hoffa himself. He was not only the president of the Teamsters Union, the largest union in the country in the 1950s and 1960s, he was also a very colorful figure — a combative, feisty guy who was built like a boxer. But there were forces surrounding Hoffa's disappearance which added to the allure: Robert F. Kennedy's vendetta against Hoffa when Kennedy was attorney general (which ultimately led to Hoffa being convicted of crimes and sent to prison); President Nixon's reelection campaign in 1972 — Nixon wanted the Teamsters' support, and so in 1971 he commuted Hoffa's prison sentence to time served, which resulted in Hoffa getting out of jail; and, of course,

the Mafia. Hoffa had a very long relationship with the Mafia, and I think that ultimately led to his abduction and mur-

Almost all of your prior books are nonfiction. Why did you choose to write a fiction book about Hoffa?

I have some thoughts about what happened to Hoffa at the end, but I don't know for certain. Writing a fiction book gave me the editorial license I needed to write what I hoped would be an interest-

I imagine your nonfiction books involved a lot of research. What about "Legacy of Lies" - did that involve much research?

Yes. I spent two years doing research about Hoffa and all those forces and people that were part of his life — and his disappearance. Even though the book is fiction, I wanted it to have a ring of authenticity, and you can't do that without research. I think you would find that most good books of fiction — even from celebrated authors like David Baldacci and Brad Meltzer — require a lot of

What's your writing style? Did you do an outline before you started writing "Legacy of Lies"?

I did do an outline to get started with the basic premise of the book and the principal characters. But after the beginning, the book took on a life of its own. As I began to write, I also began to wonder what should happen next, and the writing generated ideas that I would


That approach didn't work for me.

For the time being, I'm focused on marketing "Legacy of Lies" and trying to maximize its reach to audiences. So I haven't given much thought to my next book. One of my friends suggested I do a appearance also ranks as one of the great mysteries of the 20th century. That topic holds a lot of appeal to me. But I think there, too, it would have to be fiction - unless I could do what no one else has done: figure out what happened


